



## **Cavotec New Zealand Staff Safe, Business Continues Following Quake**

Following the February 22 earthquake that struck Christchurch, New Zealand, the Cavotec engineering group is able to report that all its New Zealand-based staff and families are safe and well, and that the impact on the Group's Christchurch operations will be limited.

"All New Zealand Cavotec staff and their families are in good health, and we have secured alternative office space to ensure that we return to full capacity as swiftly as possible," notes Cavotec MoorMaster's General Manager, David Williams.

Cavotec's New Zealand premises, located in Amuri Park in Christchurch's Central Business District, is one of the Group's Centres of Excellence that develops Cavotec's automated mooring technology, MoorMaster.

Authorities have classed the building as being 'yellow stickered' – a status that restricts access and denotes that the structure requires further evaluation.

In the days after the quake, Cavotec staff was able to continue working, albeit at reduced capacity from home, and maintained contact with regular telephone conferencing. Staff will move into the replacement premises in week commencing March 7.
